



Cleaning Instructions for Wood Framed Mirrors

When Cleaning the Wood Frame:

- Dust frames with a soft grit free cloth or feather duster.
 - Clean with a soft grit free cloth dampened only with water.
 - Wipe dry gently.
 - **Never** spray any cleaning product on or near the frame itself. Whether it is made of wood or other material, it can discolor the frame and in some instances even change the finish completely. To clean your mirror, vanity or faucet, spray cleaners onto a rag to prevent the solvents from coming in contact with the frame. Should a cleaner or solvent come in contact with frame, wipe it off immediately with a damp cloth.
 - **Never** use any cleaners that contain ammonia, vinegar, acids or alkalis as they can damage the frame and ruin the finish.
 - **Never** use sponges or abrasive cleaning pads for cleaning. These will erode and scratch the finish.
 - **Never** use painter's tape on the mirror frame as this will remove the finish.
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When Cleaning the Mirror:

- Clean mirror with a soft, lint-free cloth and warm water.
- Be careful to not allow the edges of the mirror to become wet over a period of time.
- Be sure to dry all joints and edges thoroughly to be certain that no commercial cleaner comes in contact with the frame, edge and backing
- **Never** spray any cleaner directly onto the mirror. Instead apply the cleaner to the soft cloth and then wipe the mirror. This will also prevent "puddling" at the mirror edge where the cleaner could attack the backing.
- **Never** use commercial cleaners that contains ammonia, vinegar, acids or alkalis All of these can attack the surface edges and back of the mirror resulting in black edge.
- **Never** use an abrasive cleaner on any mirror surface.
